Safety Information


Please read carefully...


- ✓ Check the product for defects before installing.
- **X** DO NOT INSTALL THE ELEMENT INTO THE TOP OF THE RADIATOR.
- ✓ Ensure any cables/wires supplied with the product are in good condition.
- ✓ Only use products supplied to install.
- **X** Do not attempt to open or modify the control head on the element.
- Read all the instructions in the manual before beginning installation if in doubt use a qualified electrician.
- This product is for indoor use only.
- This product must be connected to your electricity supply by a qualified electrician.

Installation

Tools required for installing:


1. Adjustable spanner






Unbox and stand your radiator with the inlet(s) you will be inserting the element into facing upwards, making sure the unit is sat on a waterproof surface.


*Design of radiator will differ depending on model.



Remove the blanking plug from the inlet you will be fitting the element to by turning the blanking plug anticlockwise.




Insert the element into the inlet, some Glycol may spill out of the inlet, this is normal. Clean any spillage with a dry cloth and replace any spilled liquid with water.



Use an adjustable spanner to tighten the head into the radiator until it is tight and the control faces forward. You can use PTFE tape on the element thread to aid with this. **DO NOT twist the head by hand.**



Install your Radiator as per the provided installation guide. Ensure that the elements are fitted to the bottom of your radiator.



The element must be wired up by a qualified electrician in accordance with local electrical wiring regulations.
